Arrival to Tel Aviv

We expect all of you would be arriving no later than Saturday night to Israel. You will be landing in Ben Gurion International Airport, located a few km from Tel Aviv. http://www.iaa.gov.il/RASHAT/en-US/Airports/BenGurion

You first need to exchange for some local currency as most commerce is taking place in NIS (New Israeli Shekel). 1 Euro ≈ 4.80 NIS

There are two ways to get to Tel Aviv:

Taxi: get a formal taxi from the airport. You can either get the meter, or arrange a fixed price ahead of the ride. The usual fixed fare to anywhere in Tel Aviv should be around 150 NIS (about 30 Euros). Could be a little more if it's later in the evening.

Train: a cheaper option is taking the train from the airport to Tel Aviv and then take a local taxi to the hotel. Problem is that service on Saturday is very limited.

There are three trains only on Saturday:

You need to get off at "Tel Aviv – Hashalom". Ride costs 16 NIS (3.3 Euros). Then take a taxi to the hotel (this should cost no more than 50 NIS). http://www.rail.co.il/EN/Pages/Homepage.aspx
